

What we do



Develop standardised monitoring and reporting instruments for SDG indicator 16.10.2 to assist countries in tracking their ATI progress.



Pilot global data collection in collaboration with UNESCO Institute for Statistics (UIS) on the implementation of ATI guarantees in 43 developing and least developed countries that submit Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs) to the UN High-Level Political Forum (UNHLPF) in 2019.



Produce global reports on progress in the field of access to information, including in the context of SDGs.



Strengthen the capacity of Member States to monitor and report progress in access to information.



Advocate for SDGs and ATI, and promote concrete actions to improve public access to information through public awareness-raising activities, such as the Open Talks on the International Day for Universal Access to Information (IDUAI), with governments, civil society, media and academics.

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





Don't Buy, Just Swap: Consume responsibly for a more sustainable world

Koç University Suna Kıraç Library not only adopts United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) but also implements and updates its services according to them. Our library provides equal access to information, actively works for the improvement of education quality and prepares services and activities within the scope of different SDGs. Together with our library staff, we have established a Sustainability Committee. The main purposes of the committee is to raise awareness about SDGs on campus by organizing services, activities and training on environmental and sustainable issues.

One of the first accomplishments of the Sustainability Committee was to translate the definition of IFLA ENSULIB' "What is a Green Library" into Turkish. The Turkish translation is now accessible on IFLA ENSULIB's website. This translation's valuable content has made a big impact and

it also showed us that more work needs to be done in this field. Therefore, we are also planning to translate IFLA's other texts on Green Libraries.

We also participated in the "Trade Fair Event" held at the Koç University's main campus with Suna Kıraç Library Book Swap stand. One of the first things that comes to mind regarding book swaps is ensuring the process to exchange the books is simple. Since consumption habits are one of the most critical behaviors that need attention and change for a more sustainable and green future, our aim while planning the book swap was to draw attention to responsible consumption.

Sticking to this idea and keeping the SDGs in mind, we designed a poster for the Book Swap. We also included related UN SDG

icons in our poster. Thus, we informed those participating in the Book Swap how they can support the environment and ensure sustainability.

During the Book Swap, we had many visitors and supporters. We re-enforced the messag that by swapping books, visitors could not only easily access what is needed, but could also support the environment and sustainability. Our participants were impressed at how a simple exchange action can have such a positive impact.

Following positive feedback, the Sustainability Committee is planning Textbook Swaps. Suna Kıraç Library continues to work on projects to address and draw attention to SDGs, environmental and climate issues while supporting an equal, quality education across the University.







LIBRARY'S CAMPAIGN IMPROVES SUSTAINABILITY AND DECREASES RESOURCE CONSUMPTION



In 2016, the <u>University College Cork (UCC) Library</u> launched its <u>sustainability campaign</u>. Love Our Library. As a result of actions taken in the campaign's first year, the Library saved over 155,000 KWH - a 9% reduction in energy use. This savings is enough to power a light bulb for 1,770 years or travel around the world 24 times in an electric car!

The UCC, like all public-sector organisations in Ireland, was obliged under the Public-Sector Energy Efficiency Programme to increase efficiency by 33% by the year 2020. A 2016 review identified the UCC Library, the heart of the campus both geographically and functionally, as one of the greatest energy consumers on campus – accounting for up to 10% of the university's overall energy use.

The University's Energy Manager proposed a new energy-saving initiative, which the Library agreed to pilot. With the "Saver Saves" scheme the Library was given a budget for energy - if they underspent, the savings could be kept and used for environmental projects, but if they overspent, there would be an extra cost to the library.

The Library formed a Green Team to include library staff, the University's Energy Manager, Sustainability Officer and others. They focused on monitoring waste management, energy and water use, identifying areas for improvement and examining the environmental impact of library operations.

As the entire University community would be impacted by this initiative, effective communication was essential to get and keep everyone involved. The team spread the Love Our Library campaign message to the University's faculty, staff and students, using signage, email and social media. Students were asked to sign a pledge to help the Library make changes, and within 24 hours of its promotion, over 1,000 students had signed up in support.

After analysing usage behaviors, the Library implemented measures to decrease energy use. They re-balanced the air ventilation and heating systems, reduced building operating times, and turned off lights in low occupancy areas during the summer months.

The Library also introduced a waste management and recycling programme. All bins were removed from staff offices and student areas, and two recycling stations were placed on the ground floor of the library. Single use cups were banned and alternative bamboo mugs and sugar cane bottles went on sale in the library. Water fountains were revamped, and students were encouraged to bring and refill their own water bottles. A dishwasher was purchased so catering for conferences and meetings in the Library could be provided without single-use products.

Influencing people's behaviour has been a major success of the campaign. In three years, over 1,000,000 kWh of electricity and €65,000 have been saved. The surplus from the initiative was used to install a new air cutain at the main entrance, a living wall in the library's 24-hour reading room and to purchase an electric van. The Love Our Library campaign contributed to UCC being named the 9th "greenest" university in the UI Green Metric World University Rankings for 2017, 2018 and 2019. The ethos of the Sustainable Development Goals to "think globally; act locally," is fundamental to this campaign and continues to be embraced by University staff and students.


